

Pipeline House Parties: Bringing It Home

Pipeline House Parties are an opportunity for us to chill and chat in a more intimate setting with pipeline fighters from the Dakota Access fight and other pipeline fights closer to home. These pipelines are something in the news that many of us don't know as much about as we might like to. Let's get together, have some fun, and figure out what the heck is going on!

General Format

- Guests arrive
- Mingle/Food/Blanket and Warm Clothes Collection
- Host will give a short speech.
- MN350 speaker speaks
- Speaker from ally/indigenous group speaks (*optional*)
- Short Q&A with speaker(s).
- An Ask from the host. Get involved, sign up for email lists, donation, etc.
- Break off, continuing to chill & chat till closing time (If you've invited live musicians to the event, this would be a great time to have them play)

Overall Goals

- Collecting blankets and warm clothing for protesters, as the weather begins to get colder at pipeline sites.
- Updating guests as to the situation in Standing Rock
- Making a connection for the guests between the DAPL and other lines in the area, such as Line 3.
- Bringing people's awareness to the overall issue of climate change, stressing the need for immediate action.
- Ultimately instilling a sense of hope in the guests, and a sense that this movement *is* for them, and about them.
- Allow opportunities for guests to give and get involved the same night.

8 Tips For Hosting a Great Pipeline Houseparty.

1. Picking a good night/date. Avoid picking a day when you know there may be another big event for a big portion of your social circle. Also, be aware of weather.
2. Encourage people to bike or bus to the event. Not only will this be easy on the environment, but it will help a lot with having to deal with parking.
3. Create an inviting space. Be creative with it. Do you have musical friends? Invite them.
4. You're hosting a house party because you plan to get people there. This is for your own social circle. MN350 can provide someone to speak about current pipeline fights, we can provide literature, we can provide swag, and of course, you can always be in touch with us if you have any questions along the way. MN 350 will also target email people in your area a week before the event, but DO NOT rely on this as your recruitment plan. Again, you are responsible for the attendance.
5. As a host, it is up to you to provide food and drink if you choose. Some may provide a full meal themselves, others may provide only hors d'oeuvres, others may choose to host a potluck-style party. It is totally up to you.
6. Remember that every pipeline party will be different. What's important is that you host an event that you and your friends will enjoy, and nobody knows this better than you!
7. Keep the speeches short but powerful. There are times for long, detailed lectures, but this is not one of those times.
